Kitchenhands assist kitchen and service staff in preparing and serving food, and clean food preparation and service areas.

Other jobs in this field of work

What kitchenhands do



- clean kitchens, food preparation areas and sculleries
- clean cooking and general utensils used in kitchens and restaurants
- transfer, weigh and check supplies and equipment
- assemble and prepare ingredients for cooking, and prepare salads, savouries and sandwiches
- pack food and beverage trays for serving
- cook, toast and heat simple food items
