What motor vehicle and vehicle parts salespersons do



- determine customer requirements and advise on product range, price, delivery, warranties and product use and care
- show vehicles to customers and test driving vehicles with customers
- sell motor vehicles and vehicle products such as parts, tyres, lubricating oils, batteries, car stereos and alarms
- take sales orders and prepare contracts of sale
- receive orders for parts
- determine part sizes and details such as vehicle make, model, manufacturer and year
- search lists of parts to identify part numbers, price and availability
