

Product Assembler

Product assemblers put together components and subassemblies that go into the production of metal products, electrical and electronic equipment, jewellery and precious metal articles, and joinery products.

Job title examples



- Product Assembler / Production Assembler
- Engineering Production Worker
- Machine Operator/Assembler
- Trades Assistant

Other jobs in this field of work

What product assemblers do



- locate, position and secure components on workbenches
- punch and drill mounting holes in parts and assembled products
- assemble and secure components in sequence
- assemble parts by nailing, screwing, gluing and dowelling, riveting, crimping, soldering and spot welding components
- fit hardware items, such as hinges, catches and knobs, to parts
- attach and fasten jewellery and jewellery parts to fabricate bracelets, necklaces, brooches and earrings
- deburr and finish items using files, grinding wheels and emery paper
- may manually wind light electrical field coils

Certificate II in Furniture Making available as a traineeship or qualification

Certificate III in Resource Processing available as a traineeship or qualification
